Nevelist and playwright Piers Paul Read was born in Beaconsfield, England on March 7, 1941. He was educated by Benedictine Monks at Ampleforth College, York and also at St. John's College, Cambridge. His non-fiction includes Alive: The Story of the Andes Survivors, an account of the aftermath of a plane crash in the Andes which has sold five million copies worldwide and was later adapted as the film Alive; The Templars, a history of the Crusades; and Alec Guinness: The Authorised Biography, a profile of the acclaimed late actor.

His first novel was published in 1966. More recent novels include On the Third Day, A Patriot in Berlin, and Alice in Exile.

Piers Paul Read is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature, and a member of the Council of the Society of Authors. He has also written a number of television plays, and several of his novels have been adapted for film and television. He lives in London.

Ron Hansen was born in Omaha, Nebraska and educated at Creighton University, the University of Iowa's Writers Workshop, and at Stanford University, where he held a Wallace Stegner Creative Writing Fellowship. He is the Gerard Manley Hopkins, S.J. Professor in the Arts and Humanities at Santa Clara.

He has received fellowships from the Michigan Society of Fellows, the National Endowment for the Arts, the John Simon Guggenheim Foundation, and the Lyndhurst Founda-

tion, and was presented with an Award in Literature from the American Academy and Institute of Arts and Letters.

Hansen's seven novels include *The Assassination of Jesse James* by the Coward Robert Ford, which was made into a film of the same name, and *Atticus*, a finalist for the National Book Award. His latest novel is *Exiles*.
