

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Author chronicles his journey to uncover 'the true face of Jesus' Ignatius Press publishes award-winning journalist Paul Badde's 'The Face of God'

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 21, 2010 – "The Face of God" is a "gripping cultural thriller," declares the German newsmagazine "Der Spiegel." Such praise is common for well-written mysteries, detective stories, thrillers, and other works of fiction.

This book, however, is not fiction.

In "The Face of God: The Rediscovery of the True Face of Jesus," journalist, historian and best-selling author Paul Badde reports in tantalizing detail on his exciting quest to uncover the truth behind a rare, mysterious cloth housed in small church in the remote village of Manoppello, Italy. Better known as the Holy Face of Manoppello, this is a relic recently rediscovered and, prior to Badde's research, thought by many to be "Veronica's Veil" – the cloth used to wipe Jesus' face as He carried his cross to Golgotha for crucifixion.

Badde's research and reports on the Holy Face of Manoppello prompted a 2006 visit to the relic by Pope Benedict XVI – in spite of counsel against it by others in the Vatican. Badde compiles and expands on those dispatches in "The Face of God."

The German newspaper Bild called the results of Badde's work "almost beyond our imagination."

The image of a man's face on the cloth in Manoppello is clearly visible. Most astonishing—when the face of the Shroud of Turin is laid over the Holy Face of Manoppello, the two images form a perfect match. They are the same face.


Unlike the image on the Shroud, however, which is a "negative," the Holy Face of Manoppello is a "positive" image on a cloth made of byssus, or sea silk, a rare and delicate fabric woven from a silky filament produced by mollusks. The fabric is so thin and delicate it is impossible to paint on.

"The Face of God" reports the conclusion by experts that the cloth of Manoppello is not Veronica's veil, but rather a burial cloth of Jewish tradition that was laid over the face of Jesus in the tomb.

The book recounts Badde's thrilling journey of discovery as he travels to research this remarkable relic, tracing the turbulent history of the Holy Face from ancient times to the historic visit to Manoppello by Pope Benedict XVI.

Badde is a best-selling author, renowned journalist and historian. He has been an editor of *Die Welt* since 2000, first as the Jerusalem correspondent and, most recently, as the Vatican correspondent in Rome. His other works include "Maria of Guadalupe: Shaper of History, Shaper of Hearts;" "Jerusalem, Jerusalem;" and "The Heavenly City."

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
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Ignatius Press will publish "The Face of God" in November, in hardcover, and Badde will be in the U.S. for a multi-city book tour that same month.

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'The Face of God: The Rediscovery of the True Face of Jesus'

In "The Face of God: The Rediscovery of the True Face of Jesus," Paul Badde reports in tantalizing detail on his exciting quest to discover the truth behind a rare cloth, housed in small church in the remote village of Manoppello, Italy. Among others, readers will meet Sister Blandina Paschalis Schlömer, O.S.C.O., whom many outside of Italy recognize as the first person to truly rediscover the Holy Face of Manoppello. Her meticulous research and investigations helped convince Badde and others that the Holy Face provides a "positive" image of the same face shown as a "negative" on the Shroud of Turin.


The image of a man's face on the cloth in Manoppello is clearly visible. Most astonishing—when the face of the Shroud of Turin is laid over the Holy Face of Manoppello, the two images form a perfect match. As Sr. Blandina proved with her work, they are the same face.

Readers will learn about a cloth made of unique and rare fabric—byssus—that is the "canvas" for the Holy Face. Yet, Badde explains that byssus, also is known as sea silk, is a rare and delicate fabric woven from a silky filament produced by mollusks that is so thin and delicate it is impossible to paint on.

In the book, Badde reports the conclusion by experts that the cloth of Manoppello is not Veronica's veil, but rather a burial cloth of Jewish tradition that was laid over the face of Jesus in the tomb. In fact, in the chapter he calls "Holy Blood," Badde makes the compelling case for the existence—with locations—of all the elements of the traditional Jewish burial wrap used in Jesus' time.

The book recounts Badde's thrilling journey of discovery as he travels to research this remarkable relic, tracing the turbulent history of the Holy Face from ancient times to the historic visit to Manoppello by Pope Benedict XVI.

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
Paul Badde was born 1948.

He is known throughout Europe as a historian and journalist, and already has produced best sellers as an author.


For the past 10 years, he has been an editor for the German newspaper Die Welt. He initially served as the paper's Jerusalem correspondent. He went on to become the Rome-based Vatican correspondent.

"The Face of God" is Badde's fourth original work. He also wrote "Maria of Guadelupe: Shaper of History, Shaper of Hearts;" "Jerusalem, Jerusalem," and "The Heavenly City."

Badde achieved world-wide fame with his publication of Zvi Kalitz's "Jossel Rakover's Return to God," which he rediscovered, translated and edited.

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Pope receives the key to Manoppello, Italy

Award-winning author Paul Badde prompts town to recognize Pope Benedict XVI's visit

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 03, 2010 – Today, awardwinning German author Paul Badde saw a dream come true. Officials from the town of Manoppello, Italy, presented Pope Benedict XVI with a golden key to Manoppello.

Badde's investigation of a mysterious relic he rediscovered in the chapel at Manoppello is the basis of his new book, "The Face of God: The Rediscovery of the True Face of Jesus."

Ignatius Press has published "The Face of God," and Badde will be in the U.S. beginning Nov. 9 to talk about the Holy Veil of Manoppello, which he calls "the most precious relic the Church has."



In 1998, Badde first learned of the mysterious cloth in Manoppello. It's made of one of history's rarest and most expensive fibers. Although it's impervious to paint and more flame resistant than asbestos, that cloth bears a clearly visible image of a man's face. Most astonishing—when the face of the Shroud of Turin is laid over the Holy Face of Manoppello, the two images form a perfect match. They are the same face.

Badde calls this cloth "the first page of the Gospels ... and not created by man."


Badde's reporting on his investigation into the Holy Veil prompted Pope Benedict to visit Manoppello in 2006 to see the relic – against the advice of some in the Vatican.

Badde became the first person ever to be awarded the key to Manoppello in May 2010. During his brief acceptance speech, he urged officials and the residents of Manoppello to extend a second key. "In my speech," he said, "I suggested that Pope Benedict deserves the key even more than I." In urging townspeople to give the leader of the Catholic Church a key to Manoppello, Badde made two other requests.

"I suggested that they fashion a key much like the golden key to heaven that Jesus is handing to St. Peter – the first Pope – in the Sistine Chapel's Perugino's Fresco," Badde said. "I also suggested that the spot where the Pope's helicopter landed in 2006 – where he first set foot in Manoppello – be named Piazza Benedetto in his honor. I am thrilled that all of these things have come to pass!"

During an Oct. 24 festival in Manoppello, officials formally dedicated "Piazza Benedetto" and announced that the

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Pope would "willingly accept" the key to Manoppello – which had been created to match the golden key shown in Perugino's Fresco.


After his weekly audience today, a delegation from Manoppello presented Pope Benedict XVI with the key.

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


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"The Face of God: The Rediscovery of the True Face of Jesus" By Paul Badde
