

Lesson 1: There Is One God—The Blessed Trinity

In this lesson the Sign of the Cross and the Glory Be are introduced. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross we give praise to the three persons of the Blessed Trinity. When we say the Glory Be, we are showing that we believe that God always was and always will be.

Vocabulary

Blessed Trinity: we call the three persons in one God the Blessed Trinity **mystery:** something we cannot fully understand

How many Gods are there? *There is one God, and there are three persons in the one God: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.*

We are special because we are made in the image of God.



The two stories for this lesson are adaptations of Mark 12:41–44 and Luke 10:30–37. We are made in the image of God to do what God does. God loves us; God loves everyone. Because God loves us and everyone, we should love ourselves and everyone else. First we should love God (then we should love ourselves, and then we should love others as God loves us). When we love others, we make ourselves happy because we are acting as God made us to act.

Whom are we to love? *We are to love God, ourselves, and everyone else.*


