
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LESSON 1: THERE IS ONE GOD— THE BLESSED TRINITY



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
Suggested Activity

Who is our Creator? God is our Creator.





Why are we special to God? *We are special because we are made in the image of God.*



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

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

Lesson 5: Love Others as God Loves You

When we love others, we make ourselves happy because we are acting as God made us to act.

We are to love God, ourselves, and everyone else.


