Sorry, can't do Sundays, as I'll be watching TV.


I spoke to you on the phone just last week; what's the point of my coming to the party!

You should have had the party in the forest. Then I'd have come.


I was at the party last year—surely that must be enough?

"For where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them."




Jesus "is present in His word, since it is He Himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church."
